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

The essence of Christmas does not depend on whether Christ Jesus was born in December or on another date, as many have argued in different denominational settings.

"...To this END was I BORN, and for this CAUSE came I into the world, that I should bear WITNESS unto the truth..." John 18:37

"...For this PURPOSE the Son of God was MANIFESTED [REVEALED], that he might DESTROY the WORKS of the devil." 1 John 3:8

And so, this Month December 2025 is themed: JESUS CHRIST – OUR EMMANUEL! – “THE SAVIOUR & THE GOD WITH US.”

This theme highlights our exploration of Christ Jesus - our SAVIOUR, the One who brings our SALVATION and whose PRINCIPLES guide us to live as He lived in humanity. It also calls us to understand the implications of Him being OUR EMMANUEL, the GOD WITH US, as we do life and live godly in the grace.



The prophecy of His birth must be known and understood by every believer, for His coming in the flesh was foretold centuries earlier. These prophecies are found in Isaiah 9:6–7; Isaiah 7:14; Micah 5:2, spoken by holy prophets under divine inspiration as they were moved by the Holy Spirit (2 Timothy 3:16–17; 2 Peter 1:19–21; Hebrews 1:1–14). And by the working of God, these ancient prophecies were fulfilled in the accounts of Matthew 1:18–20, 23 and Luke 2:1–20.

Christ means the Anointed One, the Messiah, the Saviour, the Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel.

Throughout this Month December 2025, as we approach Christmas Day, we will discuss and explore the birth of Jesus Christ - our Saviour, Lord, and King - and what His Person and His Principles mean to us today as we do life on earth and live godly toward Father God.

IGNORANCE - A DEADLY AND KILLER DISEASE: DON'T KEEP COMPANY WITH IGNORANCE - KEEP IT FAR AWAY!

"And the times of this IGNORANCE God WINKED [OVERLOOKED] at; but now COMMANDETH all men EVERY WHERE to REPENT: 31 because he hath APPOINTED a day, in the which he will JUDGE the world in RIGHTEOUSNESS by that man whom he hath ORDAINED; whereof he hath given ASSURANCE unto all men, in that he hath RAISED him from the dead" Acts 17:30-31.

Ignorance is not harmless. It is a silent destroyer, a spiritual disease that cripples destiny, limits growth, and blinds the believer from walking in the light of God's truth. To be INFORMED is to be TRANSFORMED and EMANCIPATED. Life is worth living, and in Christ, it is meant to be lived with understanding, revelation, clarity and truth. Therefore, give no room to ignorance in matters of life and godliness.

Do not allow ignorance to make you a prey in the hands of the enemy.
Don't tolerate it. Don't partner with it. Don't excuse it.
Seek knowledge. Pursue it. Buy it. Own it. Guard it as a treasure.

Jesus Himself warned,
"Ye do err, not knowing the Scriptures, nor the power of God." - Matthew 22:29

THE PRICELESS VALUE OF KNOWLEDGE

"Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto TREASURE hid in a field; the which when a man hath found, he HIDETH, and for joy thereof GOETH and SELLETH all that he hath, and BUYETH that field. 45 Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto a MERCHANT man, seeking GOODLY PEARLS: 46 who, when he had found one pearl of great price, went and SOLD all that he had, and BOUGHT it" Matthew 13:44-46.

Knowledge is treasure, and the believer must pursue it with intentionality. This pursuit is not optional - it is vital to growth and spiritual soundness.
And here lies one of the greatest Christmas-season lessons from the life of Jesus:

JESUS - GOD WITH US - YET A SEEKER OF KNOWLEDGE (Luke 2:41-52)

In Luke 2:41-52, we see a profound picture of Jesus at age twelve. Though He was God in the flesh - Emmanuel - God with us, He still submitted Himself to the discipline of learning. He sat among teachers, listening, asking questions, engaging with Scripture, seeking deeper understanding. He was not casual about knowledge. He was not complacent. He did not permit ignorance - not even as a child.
This silently but powerfully teaches us: If JESUS sought knowledge, how much more must we?

Break Free from Blindness

He grew in wisdom, stature, and favour with God, and with men (Luke 2:52). Growth requires knowledge. Favour is strengthened by understanding. Destiny is shaped by revelation. The Son of God modelled for us the posture we must take: a humble, intentional, persistent hunger for knowledge.

INVEST IN KNOWLEDGE - IT WILL DISTINGUISH YOU

“Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.” - 2 Timothy 2:15.

“But continue thou in the things which thou hast learned and hast been assured of, knowing of whom thou hast learned them; 15 and that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. 16 All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: 17 that the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works.” - 2 Timothy 3:14–17.

Invest in your growth. Read. Research. Ask questions. Think. Seek understanding. Attend places where truth is taught without prejudice or hypocrisy. Buy books. Study diligently. Build yourself daily.

Do not pursue knowledge for success alone, but for fulfillment, purpose, and accuracy in destiny. For excellence without understanding is instability; success without knowledge is fragile.

Make the WORD OF GOD your primary foundation. Other books may inform you, but the Bible TRANSFORMS you. It is the only book whose Author is present every time you read it. Become like the Bereans - noble, discerning, grounded (Acts 17:10–12).

You are responsible for your own growth. You are the custodian of your own joy and fulfillment.

KNOWLEDGE PROTECTS - IGNORANCE DESTROYS

“The heart of him that hath understanding seeketh knowledge: but the mouth of fools feedeth on foolishness.” - Proverbs 15:14.

“The heart of the prudent getteth knowledge; and the ear of the wise seeketh knowledge.” - Proverbs 18:15

Ignorance leads to abuse - ABUSE is “abnormal use.” You will misuse what you do not understand. You will mishandle what you cannot interpret. You will miss opportunities you cannot recognise. Do not allow such a tragedy in this season of God With Us.

Break Free from Blindness

Christ came to bring LIGHT, not confusion. He came to bring REVELATION, not blindness. He came to free you - not just from sin, but from ignorance.

BE INFORMED. BE TRANSFORMED. BE EMANCIPATED.

Give no room to ignorance at any level. Guard your mind. Pursue wisdom. Seek understanding. Walk in revelation. You are worth the best that God has given - and He has given you His WORD, His SPIRIT, and His LIGHT.

Let this be the month you rise above every trace of ignorance and walk in the knowledge that makes for victory, clarity, and godly living in Christ Jesus.

This December... this Christmas, you are invited into a season that is far more than lights, gifting, or festivity. Christmas is the yearly commemoration and celebration of God's love to mankind, expressed in the birth of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, and in His redemptive work for the good of all humanity.

To help you walk through this season in wisdom, balance, and spiritual clarity, here are Ten Christmas Wisdom Nuggets - simple principles that will secure you in grace and blessedness as you journey through December.

1. Prepare Your Soul for Christmas

Romans 12:1–2; Revelation 3:20; Luke 2:7b

This season, prepare room in the inner chambers of your heart for the Lord. Christmas becomes meaningful only when Christ finds a place within you, not just around you.

2. Do Not Burden Yourself With Worry

Matthew 6:25–34

Refuse to allow the pressure of gifts, shopping, and seasonal expectations to weigh you down or drive you into debt. Escape the trap of “buy today and pay later in worry.” Anxiety is not a Christmas gift - peace is.

3. Give Yourself Before You Give Your Gift

2 Corinthians 8:1–5; 2 Corinthians 9:7–11; Psalm 49:6–9

God desires your heart first. Your life is more valuable than any material offering. Remember: Giving is living.

4. Don't Measure a Gift by Its Cost

Luke 21:1–5; Matthew 2:11

The value of a gift is in the love behind it - not its price. Even the simplest gift can carry the deepest meaning.

5. Don't Leave Christ Outside Christmas

Matthew 2:13

Joseph stayed attentive to God's instruction during the celebration, and it preserved Jesus from danger. Likewise, stay spiritually sensitive. Don't let Christmas become a time when spiritual neglect opens doors for harm.

6. Don't Replace Christ With Seasonal Characters

Ephesians 3:13–14; Colossians 1:27; Luke 2:11

Father Christmas is not your Saviour - Christ is. Avoid practices or performances that distort the meaning of Christmas or promote fear instead of joy.

7. Do Not Neglect the Needy

James 1:27; 2:14–20; Deuteronomy 15:11; Mark 14:7

Christmas is a powerful opportunity to extend God's love to those who lack. Someone's answered prayer may be tied to your act of kindness.

8. Don't Neglect Your Church Family

Hebrews 10:25; John 4:20–24; Philippians 3:3; 1 Corinthians 1:9; 14:25

Fellowship keeps your heart aligned with Christ. Worship and service deepen the meaning of Christmas. Decorate your heart before you decorate your home.

9. Embrace Childlike Humility

Mark 10:15

Christmas calls for a child-like heart - simple, trusting, humble - not childish behaviour. Choose purity of spirit over seasonal recklessness.

10. Worship God With Your Heart and Your Life

Matthew 2:11; John 3:16; Revelation 3:20; John 1:12

Let Christ be the center of your celebration. Set your affection on Him, and give Him your heart in worship, honour, and love.

And Finally...

Keep selfishness out of your Christmas. Selfishness makes Christmas a burden.

Love makes Christmas peaceful, joyful, and meaningful.

Remember:

Giving is living. Contentment is great gain. Christ is the reason for the season.

The Angelic Encounter with Joseph – When God Steps Into Human Uncertainty

The story of Christmas is filled with bright lights, angelic songs, and prophetic wonders - but tucked quietly within Matthew's Gospel is a moment often overlooked, yet deeply human: Joseph's encounter with the angel of the Lord.

Joseph was not a prophet. Not a priest. Not a miracle worker.

He was a carpenter - steady, responsible, and faithful. And yet God entrusted him with one of the most delicate, history-altering assignments in Scripture.

A SHATTERING DISCOVERY

The story begins not with celebration, but with tension.



A SHATTERING DISCOVERY

Just as Joseph had resolved in his heart what to do, an angel appeared to him in a dream, carrying a message that would reshape not only his life but the entire world:

"Joseph, son of David, fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife: for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Ghost." - Matthew 1:20

The angel reminded him of his identity - son of David - anchoring Joseph in his prophetic lineage. Even in moments of confusion, God speaks to who we truly are.

Then came the revelation: Mary's child was divine. Holy. Fulfillment of ancient prophecy. The long-awaited Saviour.

THE EMMANUEL PROPHECY

The angel's message culminated in one of the most profound declarations in Scripture:

"They shall call His name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us."

- Matthew 1:23

This was not merely a name - it was an announcement.

Joseph's Fear Meets Revelation


Silent obedience. Courage without spotlight. Faith expressed in responsibility.

HOPE BEHIND THE WALLS

A Prison Outreach That Carried Light Into Confinement

On Friday, **28th November 2025**, a silent move of God swept through the grounds of the **Port Harcourt Correctional Centre** - not with fanfare, but with footsteps carrying purpose, compassion, and the unashamed message of hope. In partnership with the **Raham Foundation**, the **CEFMORSI International Foundation (CIF)** stepped behind prison walls to remind men in confinement that although bars may restrain their bodies, God's love remains unconstrained.



For the **CIF Coordinator, Mrs. Oladimeji**, the mission began long before arrival. Travelling first from Ado-Ekiti to Akure, then embarking on an 11-hour trip to Port Harcourt, she carried the mandate of the ministry across states and through exhaustion. Upon arrival, she was warmly received by **Mrs. Golda**, another CIF representative. Both were lodged at D'Manuel Hotel, where they prepared spiritually and mentally for the assignment ahead. On the morning of the outreach, the team set out early - ready, expectant, and deeply aware that someone's life could change forever.

The team arrived at the correctional facility and observed strict procedures: waiting for approval, undergoing searches, and surrendering electronic devices.

Every donated item – **exercise books, pens, chalk, markers, food, and drinks** – was inspected before entry. Once cleared, the team was guided into the prison chapel, where the atmosphere instantly shifted.

Inmates led the opening prayers.

Inmates raised the praise.

And in those moments, the chapel felt less like confinement and more like holy ground.

Testimonies That Broke the Room

Two former inmates stood before the gathering – men who had tasted both the bitterness of imprisonment and the sweetness of divine mercy.

Pst Steve

Once sentenced to death by hanging, after a tragic altercation, he spent over 14 years behind bars. But God rewrote his story. Today, he stands as an ordained minister, preaching life where death once hovered. His message was simple yet piercing:

“With God, all things are possible.”

Evangelist Akaraka

A man who entered prison as another inmate but left as a redeemed evangelist. Prison became the place where he learned to read and write, found Christ, and discovered purpose. Now he travels – often back into prisons – to declare that God transforms destinies.

Their stories strengthened the inmates, stirring hope, and renewed faith.



When **Dr. Mrs. Maureen G. Nwaeze**, Director of Raham Foundation, stepped forward, the chapel erupted. The inmates recognised her – not just as a visitor, but as a promise keeper. She reminded them of her vow to return with writing materials and food – and she fulfilled it. She assured them more help was coming – including **legal** support for those with minor or mishandled cases.

Her voice carried the weight of compassion and responsibility. She spoke like a mother addressing her sons.

Representing CIF, Mrs. Oladimeji and Mrs. Golda addressed the inmates with warmth and spiritual conviction. They shared the heart of Rev. Chukie Morsi – CIF President – whose passion for souls and unwavering support fueled this partnership.

Their message was clear:

**There is hope. There is love. There is redemption.
And as long as there is life, God is not done with you.**

A Gift of Care

After prayers and blessings, food and drinks were distributed individually to inmates. What seemed like “just packages” carried deeper meaning – someone remembered them, valued them, and cared enough to give.

The Impact Lives On

After more than two hours, the outreach ended, but its effect remained. The team departed by 4:00 p.m., hearts full, grateful, and deeply moved by the power of what God had done.

This was not simply an event – it was a rescue mission, a reminder that light still enters dark places, and a declaration that redemption can find you even behind bars.






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
